7. **NEW/UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**



 Councillor Martin expressed his appreciation to the staff that organized and worked during Sunsplash 2019. All the events were well attended and well organized.



2. Councillor Street advised Council that she had visited Trenton Drive and noticed the amount of garbage in the area that needs to be cleaned up. A resident has asked if the vacant lots are all owned by the same property owner. CAO Niblock responded that the information is available in the assessment role and can be viewed at the Town Hall.



3. Councillor Street noted that she attended a number of the Sunsplash events and they were all well-organized. Deputy Mayor responded that she has heard a lot of positive comments about the fireworks. They were on a larger scale this year because it was a combination of the fireworks from Snow & Ice, Canada Day and Sunsplash as the weather didn't cooperate during the other festivals.



 Councillor English noted that Council has been in receipt of the first quarter financial report.



5. Councillor English has requested the dates of the pension retroactive adjustment with the St. John's Regional Fire Department. Director Smith responded that the information has been requested from the City of St. John's.



6. Councillor Willis thanked Councillor English and Councillor Street for attending the Planning Committee meeting as he was unable to attend.

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7. Deputy Mayor Laurie expressed her appreciation to Town Staff that are working on the lift station. Also, the Town apologies for any inconvenience this has caused to residents.



8. Councillor English expressed his appreciation to the residents that are in the immediate vicinity of the lift station for their patience during this situation and the residents that are directly affected. Mayor Bobbett responded that the Town is doing what they can to have this issue resolved as quickly as possible and he commends staff for their extra efforts.



9. Councillor English asked staff if there is an update on the development on Christopher Street or if there is any information that can be provided to the residents regarding the lack of development? Director Glenn responded that the permit for one of the dwellings was picked up today so there should be active construction starting to take place.



10. Mayor Bobbett provided an update on the construction within the Town.

McNamara Drive:

Work has been completed on the portion of the road above the Town Hall and work on the roundabout with Topsail Road is progressing as planned. The grade is being raised, curb has been installed and Class A road material will soon be placed. It is starting to take shape and operate as a roundabout outside of construction hours. During construction, traffic continues to be controlled by flags people.

Clearview Heights

Work on the installation of storm sewer and the road upgrades are continuing as planned.

Paradise Road

This project is ahead of schedule. Most of the curb is placed and there is Class A material and asphalt in some areas.

O'Brien's Way

Construction is proceeding as planned.

Various Paving

There is only deficiencies and warranty work to complete on the 2018 street/road upgrading contract. The 2019 roads have been tendered and awarded and work will be beginning soon.

Upcoming Projects

Tender for the construction of the Lanark Drive trunk sewer and water main project has been awarded.
