3. Councillor Street informed Council and residents that she attended the Pumpkin Stroll on Friday evening and it was a very successful event. Mayor Bobbett stated that he was also in attendance. Councillor Street suggested that bouncy castles and other activities be set up in the field for next year. Mayor Bobbett responded that this can be discussed at the Recreation and Community Services Committee meeting.



4. Councillor Street noted the success of the Pre-Budget Consultation Booth that was set up in the Paradise Double Ice Complex last night. There was great conversation with residents and also non-residents. Residents are pleased with the growth in the Town and are enjoying the facilities, the upgraded roads, retail stores and development and the walking trails. Some things that were discussed that residents would like to see in the Town are an indoor soccer facility, a swimming pool and accessible transportation. A recommendation was to have cards to pass out next year regarding information on the survey as some people didn't have time to fill out the survey on site.



5. Councillor Quilty provided the below construction update:

Lanark Drive Trunk Sewer

Paving is tentatively scheduled for Archibald Drive this Friday pending weather.

Lift Station #10:

Repairs to the lift station have been completed and it is now functioning normally.

All other capital construction projects are complete with only some property reinstatement carrying forward.



6. Councillor Quilty reminded Council and residents about the Remembrance Day ceremony that is taking place on Monday, November 11 at the Town Hall at 10:55 a.m.



Proposal that was noted in the Corporate Services Committee minutes would be presented to Council for discussion. CAO Niblock responded that this was brought to Committee for discussion and was under \$5,000 so wasn't required to come to Council for approval. Councillor English responded that this is something that he feels should be brought to Council because of the implications of it and he would like to have the opportunity to have some input as a Councillor through a discussion with Knightsbridge. CAO Niblock responded that this is a small review of a previous policy and if all Council wanted to speak to them it would increase the cost. They have already been engaged to do this work and nothing will be implemented before coming to Council for approval.
