- Councillor Martin reminded Council and residents about the Snow and Ice in Paradise events that are taking place from February 5-February 9. Information about the events that are scheduled are listed on the Towns website and social media sites.



2. Councillor Street has been contacted by residents with concerns that the Town is using the orange bags to fill potholes. Residents are asking why they are used and has an environmental impact been completed on the use? Mayor Bobbett responded that they are more effective than using the cold patch asphalt. CAO Niblock noted that the orange bags are very visible, has less impact on cars and other Municipalities across the Country have started using them. The bags will be picked up before the staff fill the holes with asphalt. Councillor Street asked if cones could be used in place of the bags as the bags are messy and fall apart.

CAO Niblock responded that the Town have used cones in the past but they tend to impede traffic, blow away and cars get damaged.

- Councillor Street asked if the Town could post a notice on social media to ask residents to watch out for the ducks in the Elizabeth Park area. The snow is making it hard for them to be seen and there have been incidents where ducks have been struck. CAO Niblock asked Councillor Street to provide more information.
- 4. Deputy Mayor Laurie noted that the complete cheque register for January is included in the Council package. This will also be added to the Towns website.
- Councillor Quilty has had a number of concerns from residents regarding potholes throughout the Town and in particular around the Paradise Road/St. Thomas Line intersection. These concerns will be discussed at the IPW Committee meeting tomorrow evening.
- 6. Councillor Quilty informed Council and residents that she attended the Mount Pearl Paradise Chamber Best in Business Awards. Mayor Bobbett, Deputy Mayor Laurie, CAO Niblock, Director Glenn and Jennifer Penney were also in attendance and it was a great evening of highlighting businesses in Paradise and Mount Pearl. Councillor Quilty also attended the Seniors Anniversary Dinner and it was a lovely evening. Deputy Mayor Laurie and Councillor English were also in attendance for this event.

- 7. Councillor English asked for an update on Lift Station #10. CAO Niblock responded that the incident during Snowmaggedon was the force main on St. Thomas Line and had nothing to do with the lift station. Staff are repairing it this evening.
- 8. Councillor Martin has received concerns from residents regarding an AirBNB at 69 Angel's Road that had a stop work order from the Town. The house is still active with rentals. Director Glenn responded that the Town is currently dealing with an appeal. Deputy Mayor Laurie noted that there is an area on the AirBNB webpage where residents can make complaints and then AirBNB will work directly with the homeowner.
- 9. Councillor Martin asked for an update on street widening throughout the Town. CAO Niblock responded that the resources were put on clearing up the cul de sacs due to the recent snow and rain but the resources will be back to widening the streets. The streets have not been forgotten, the Town is using the resources they have to keep things clear.
